TRAFALGAR JUNIOR FOOTBALL CLUB are looking for players for our under 12s & 14


If your child is born in 2011, 2010, 2009 or 2008 we would love for them to join us for a fun filled season in our new league.

The Unit 3/4 Environmental Science class had a fantastic day at Moonlit Sanctuary on Wednesday the 2nd of March, investigating the Orange Bellied Parrot – a critically endangered, beautiful Australian bird species certainly worth saving! We fed the kangaroos and wallabies as we explored the sanctuary grounds to see many other unique species.

For me, the best part of the day was the afternoon spent volunteering at the sanctuary, assisting the keepers and site manager with clearing some of the hundreds of fallen branches from the animals habitats, put there by storms and high winds. The proud feeling I have reminds me why I am a teacher, watching them get stuck in and seeing the huge pile of branches we carried for 100-150 meters gave me that warm fuzzy feeling. They truly enjoyed the hard work, knowing they were doing something that would make a real impact. The 16 of us achieved, in 40 minutes, what would have taken Moonlit staff days to achieve and they were so grateful for our manpower. Thank you to everyone who ensured we were able to attend this excursion. It was directly connected to every dot point in our first Outcome and your support is so appreciated by myself and the students.
