Dear Parents / Carers

Thank you for your recent support with the pupil free day. It was an invaluable day for the teachers to learn and work collaboratively with a focus on differentiation to enhance student learning and engagement.

I also hope the extra long weekend was enjoyable and of benefit to many of you.

This fortnight's newsletter highlights excursions and incursions that have taken place for our students in the last couple of weeks. It is very pleasing that we can provide these extra curricula activities to extend and enhance learning and social interactions through whole school experiences for our students. We have also had sports teams in recent weeks participate in inter school activities. Our whole school athletics day is next Tuesday the 29th March at Joe Carmody track in Newborough. Students will be transported to and from school by buses. If you do want to take & pick your students up directly to and from the track, we are anticipating a 9:30 arrival at the track with a 2.15 finish. If students are leaving directly from the track, we ask for a note to allow this to occur. Your cooperation is much appreciated in regard to this.




now add to their resume.






Book Week


The next session was a lecture on Accounting by Steve Bertram, he was encouraging students to consider a career in accounting, he




If you are aged between 16-25, this is the course for you! The GTLC Domestic Building Industry Entrant course will cover basic accredited training and non-accredited training to get participants work ready to seek onsite domestic building industry labouring opportunities.

Using existing links with Industry through the Unions, we will aim for work experience opportunities for participants where possible later in the course and assist the employers with knowledge around apprenticeships to encourage ngoing work. If the participants don't land work at the end of the course, they will receive follow-up support by the GTLC while

they search for employment opportunities.
