PRINCIPAL From the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome back to the commencement of term 2. I do hope you had some time over the Easter break to spend with family and friends and enjoy the beautiful weather.

Term 2 is a shorter term of only 9 weeks and is packed full of events for students and our community, the events calendar will continue to be updated on a weekly basis so please keep an eye on this for items and activities as they are added and updated.

In the first four weeks we have the year 9 Rubicon camp, the VCE outdoor education camp, the Tertiary Information Session for seniors, NAPLAN for year 7 and 9 students and several sporting events across year levels. Students are informed and reminded of these events with the relevant permission forms and information provided at the time. It is important that they do return the permission forms and other relevant materials in the time specified as we need sufficient time to ensure we have the correct numbers for events to occur and to organise staffing. This has been particularly relevant in more recent times with increased absences of staff and students due to COVID. Thank you for your support with this.

There have recently been announcements in the media regarding the Head Start Program. Head Start gives students career planning support, a tailored pathway into the industry of their choice and a fair training wage – all while they are earning their senior secondary certificate – in key industries like building, construction, community services and health, business, primary industries and technology. At Trafalgar High School we have been fortunate in offering this program for the past three years with several students already completing their pathways and now in full time work as a direct result. Currently we have five students in the Head Start Program in a range of industries. Our Head Start co-ordinator Jess Croft works in collaboration with our careers team of Gabrielle Evans and Jodie Deppeler. She is available to discuss options and possible opportunities with senior school students.

Students from Trafalgar High School attended ANZAC ceremonies to lay wreaths alongside Ms Lee Jinks and myself this week. Sydney and Lena Blackshaw at the Thorpdale service with Liam Luke and Harry McCabe at the Trafalgar service.

We had an exciting arrival today with the new welfare room being delivered. This is a purpose built room that will provide spaces to enable the team to undertake small group activities and discussions whilst also having break out offices for individual discussions and appointments to occur.

NAPLAN ONLINE 2022

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) for Year 7 and 9 students will be held from Tuesday May 10th – 20th 2022. NAPLAN tests assess student knowledge and skills in Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. The results of the tests provide information for students, parents, teachers and principals which can be used to improve student achievement.

This year all of the NAPLAN tests will be online assessments. NAPLAN Online delivers numerous benefits including:

- a 'tailored test' design that adapts to correct and incorrect student responses providing a more precise understanding of student achievement;
- innovative use of technology, including a more engaging test design and a wider range of item types;
- the extension of the 'test window' to two weeks, allowing schools greater opportunity to schedule the tests at times that suit them best and increasing student participation.

It is important that students bring a charged laptop device and headphones to school on the above dates.

Students who are absent on a NAPLAN testing day will be expected to undertake catch up tests later in the ten day period.

In Term 3, parents/carers will receive their child's personal NAPLAN report which will describe their child's particular skills in writing, reading, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The report will show how your child performed in relation to the National Minimum Standards for students across Australia. These individual student NAPLAN reports will be distributed to parents in an envelope, along with information around how to interpret the results.

We have received our 2021 HELM! We are slowly handing them out to students who paid last year via the office, if you purchased a HELM last year and would like to collect it please come past the office for collection.


DEBATING CLUB 2022
