DOCTORS IN SCHOOLS

While Trafalgar High School didn't receive the Government Doctors in Schools initiative funds general practitioners (GPs) our locally developed partnership with Trafalgar Medical allows Students to access a GP one day a week. The GPs provide medical advice and health care to students and can make accessing these easier and with less learning time lost.

All students from years 7 to 12 are able to access an adolescent-health trained GP, and Trafalgar Medical support the service so students will not incur any out-of-

pocket expenses for student consultations with the GP.

YEAR 11 UNIVERSITY CAMP

In the first week of term 3 over 40 Year 11 students participated in the University Experience Camp. Students visited Monash, RMIT, ACU and Melbourne Universities. Students were able to hear about course offerings, available scholarships, student accommodation support and transition from high school to University. Students participated in tours that enabled them to see first-hand the facilities at each campus as well as the accommodation options. Each University conducted activities such as: visiting and setting up a Moot Court at ACU, Photography Competition at RMIT and interactive course investigation tasks at Monash. Students stayed overnight at the University College, a tertiary student residential housing, which allowed them to gain an understanding of this type of accommodation. Feedback from students was very positive and many said they had learned a great deal about potential pathways and options beyond High School.

NEW CHILD SAFE STANDARDS

Victoria's Child Safe Standards are a set of mandatory requirements to protect children and young people from harm and abuse. Last term in the newsletter we let you know the policy work School council was undertaking to update processes at our school from the Child Safe Standards that commenced in January 2016 to current requirements. After six years, we have seen how the Standards improve safety for children and young people not only at school but across the community as these also apply to footy, cricket, Scouts and all the other places our student participate in the community. This year changes have been made to make Standards even stronger and cover more ground in areas like cyber safety where technology and its use by young people has grown in recent times. The new Child Safe Standards came into force on 1 July 2022 and our school is ready to comply with these new Standards.
