turned to do the Trafalgar East run.





EDROLO

Dear Parents,



The following information outlines the key benefits of the Edrolo resource for your child as they approach their final years at school, and how to pay for their online and/or hardcopy access via the Edrolo Payment Portal. Payment must be made by 12th December 2022.

Edrolo is an essential online and textbook VCE resource to support students in their studies. Any student studying the following VCE subjects in 2023 will be using Edrolo in their VCE classes:

- Biology Units 1&2

- Business Management Units 1&2

Our school will use Edrolo as a teaching and learning tool to further enhance what is covered in class. Our teachers will use Edrolo for:

- prescribed holiday homework
- pre-class work
- post-class consolidation

- assessment preparation and exam revision
- student self-study

What does Edrolo cost?

- Standard Edrolo Course: \$27.50 incl GST per subject
- Edrolo Textbook Resource + Standard Edrolo Course: \$77 incl. GST + optional \$29 hardcopy textbook (delivered to your home address).
 - Delivery of the hardcopy books will take place in late January 2023

How do I pay via the Edrolo Payment Portal for my child's access?

Payment must be made for Edrolo via the online Edrolo Payment Portal.

If payment has not been received by or prior to December 12th, your child will be blocked from accessing all their Edrolo courses until the balance has been paid in full (no later than March 14, 2023). Please ensure payment is made by this date, as your child will have homework and classwork to complete on Edrolo through Term 4 and the summer break. As soon as account payment has been made, access to all courses will be restored.

Activating Your Edrolo Account

If your child accessed Edrolo in 2022, their account will be active and you can log in with them as normal to pay through the Payment Portal as per Step 6 below. If your child is new to Edrolo, please follow the instructions below first:

- Go to www.edrolo.com.au/activate/fvh-kxt
- Enter your child's surname and check that it recognises their correct first name
- Enter your child's school email address and choose a secure password that they will remember
- Click 'Let me in'
- Edrolo will send a confirmation email to the email address you used above head to this email and click the activation link.
- Once you have signed into your account, click on the "<u>Pay now</u>" button in the top right-hand corner of your screen and follow the prompts.



To make a payment via the Edrolo Payment Portal, follow the instructions below:


- Log into your Edrolo account at https://edrolo.com.au/account/login. If you are a parent trying to make a payment for your child, log into your child's Edrolo account using the same URL.
- Once you have logged into your account, navigate to the red Pay now button located at the top of the page to enter the Payment Portal, as shown below:



- Once you are in the Payment Portal, review your resources to ensure they align with the subjects you or your child are enrolled in.
- If your school is subscribed to optional print textbooks, select whether to add these to your purchase:



5. Next, select the blue Save and Continue button at the bottom of the page, as shown below:



- You will then be prompted to enter your shipping address details only if print textbooks are to be delivered directly to your home.
- Finally, enter your credit/debit card details and place your order. A receipt will be sent to the primary email address associated with the student's Edrolo account.
